Re-homesteading an 19th Century Ozarks Homestead

The original 40 acres of Stuhlmacher Farm was purchased in 1885 by Charles “Big Charlie” and his mother Mary Stuhlmacher. The property included a log cabin that Mary lived in until her death in 1887, when Charlie inherited it. Acreage has been bought and sold over the years, but the original 40 acres has stayed in the family all along.

Unfortunately, the farm has been all but forgotten since the early 50s (aside from the occasional camping visit every few years) when our grandmother fell ill to cancer and moved away for health reasons. The property was divided between her children for several years until our parents re-consolidated it by buying their shares.

Our generation’s goal is to “re-homestead” the property in a self-sufficient manner to create a functional homestead once again, that can be passed on the the sixth and seventh generations and beyond.
